
# THE BANK HEIST

## **Course Information**

Racers will head up **3.72 kilometres** of steep, rocky terrain weaving in and out of boulder fields and subalpine forest from mid-station to the top of the Revelation Gondola.

Elevation gain: 879m

Average grade: 23.0%

#### **Start Time**

Racing starts at **10:00 am**. Racers will be started one at a time in 30-second intervals.



Race results and prizes will be awarded at 1 pm at the Mackenzie Outpost.

#### Rules

The organizer reserves the right to penalize or disqualify participants when one of the following applies:

- Violating rules and regulations of the event
- Unfair or unsportsmanlike conduct
- Disrespecting race personnel, volunteers, officials, or other trail users, etc.

• Any disregard for the environment (littering, cutting switchbacks, etc.)

Littering of any kind is prohibited. This includes cups, gel and electrolyte drink mix wrappers and applies to the racecourse, as well as roads, resort, and staging locations.

Short-cutting of trails is prohibited. You must always stay on the primary trail tread of the marked route, as described on the map.



These rules primarily serve to ensure the runners' safety. Violating these rules can also lead to subsequent time penalty and/or disqualification from the race.

- Slower participants are required to make way for faster runners. Faster runners must give slower runners a reasonable opportunity to pull off the trail before passing.
- Course Hazards are often not marked. Run in control and be prepared for possible course hazards.
- For the safety of racers and crew, headphones, and music are not permitted.

## **Aid Stations**

The race will have **2 aid stations** around tower 17 and then at the finish line.

Aid stations will be stocked with water, electrolytes, and snacks.

Note: This is a cupless event. Please bring your own drinking vessel.
